Older and more experienced readers may read independently, but they still enjoy being read to on occasion: Please encourage daily reading for **AT LEAST: Grade K & 1=10 minutes, Grade 2=15 minutes, Grades 3 & 4=20 minutes and Grade 5=25 minutes, 4 out of 7 days each week.***

Suggestions:

- *Children are great imitators. They learn much about reading by imitating others. Model fluent reading ~ Use different expressions and voices. Model writing ~ grocery lists, thank-you notes, birthday and holiday lists, etc. Model good listening skills.
- *When it comes to reading & learning ~ we need to NEVER quit. It is not always *easy*. Sometimes our best intentions get lost and we become discouraged. Reading is developmental.
- *Provide opportunities for your child to read many things ~ signs, menus, TV guide, magazines, cook books, etc.
